

POTENTIAL PROJECT GUIDELINES

Wetlands are permanently or seasonally flooded areas with high water tables, saturated soils and water-tolerant plants. Types of wetlands include: fens, bogs, swamps, marshes, and ponds. Swamps and marshes are the most common type of wetland in Lambton and Middlesex Counties.

Cost-Share Rate:

• Up to 50%; funding source, program, & location may influence maximum grant

Purpose:

- To conserve and enhance the wetland-related natural heritage resources in the SCRCA watershed
- To conserve and protect surface water quality, prevent floods, and store water for release into streams and other shallow water systems as well as shallow aquifers

Eligibility:

- Private landowners throughout the SCRCA watershed
- Public lands throughout the SCRCA watershed

Eligible Projects:

	• Create swamps, marshes, and ponds (for wildlife)
	• Plant buffer strips around swamps, marshes, and ponds
