Engineered plans must be stamped and dated Show the location of any proposed culverts. Include the length, diameter and pipe invert. For all proposals, indicate all areas where fill will be placed and the limits of disturbance. Show the dimensions of the proposed fill area and the depth of fill required. Provide details of the type of fill proposed for use. Note a cross-section of the proposed fill is required, showing the fill depths, side slopes and elevations. Show the location of watercourses, drains, ditches, wetlands, shoreline and forested areas, indicate areas of steep slopes Show location and type of erosion control measures, installations details, a sediment maintenance plan and if necessary, a site re-vegetation plan		

Technical Reports/Studies	Drainage staff will provide the Engineer's Report and/or any additional reports or studies. CAs concerns and environmental considerations brought forward in the pre-consultation should be reflected in the engineers report Some projects like works with Wetlands, Drain Enclosures and Realignments may not meet the regulation and may require more information to ensure that the control of flooding, erosion, pollution or the conservation of land will not be affected and the interference on the natural features and hydrologic and ecological functions has been deemed to be acceptable by the SCRCA Note: In certain areas, or for certain proposals, the SCRCA may require further information to process applications. Fisheries Act On November 25, 2013, amendments to the Canadian Fisheries Act, associated Applications for Authorization (under Paragraph 35(2) (b) of the Fisheries Act Regulations) and Information Requirements Regulations came into force. Depending on the scale of works, as you will be conducting a project in/near water, the proponent has responsibilities under the Fisheries Act to ensure serious harm to fish is avoided. Ontario Water Resources Act	Under s. 53 of the Ontario Water Resources Act, stormwater management facilities serving residential developments are subject to obtain an Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA)
Endangered Species Act	Endangered Species Staff are aware that the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks has outstanding concerns with respect to species listed on the Species at Risk in Ontario list as it pertains to the Endangered Species Act (ESA) in the immediate area around this project.
