



## Executive Council

Copy of an Order-in-Council approved by Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor, dated the 8th day of May, A.D. 1974.

The Committee of Council have had under consideration the report of the Honourable the Minister of Natural Resources, dated March 14th 1974, wherein he states that,

WHEREAS the Sydenham Valley Conservation Authority, hereinafter referred to as the "Authority", was established by Order-in-Council numbered OC-106/61 dated the 12th day of January, 1961 as amended by Order-in-Council numbered OC-1449/61 dated the 20th day of April, 1961 and OC-2107/73 dated the 22nd day of August, 1973;

AND WHEREAS the Township of Enniskillen by resolution requested the Minister of Natural Resources to call a meeting for the enlargement of the Authority to include certain watersheds adjoining the northerly boundary of the area under the jurisdiction of the Authority;

AND WHEREAS a meeting was held as called by the Minister of Natural Resources at Wyoming, Ontario on the 12th day of February, 1974 with a quorum of municipal representatives and a quorum of authority members being present;

AND WHEREAS a resolution was passed by 12 municipal representatives in favour and none opposed and by 18

authority members in favour and none opposed that "the Sydenham Valley Conservation Authority be enlarged by the addition of the watersheds of all streams entering the St. Clair River and Lake Huron between the points where the north boundary of the Township of Sombra meets the shore of the St. Clair River and the point where the north boundary of the Township of Plympton meets the shore of Lake Huron and including the whole of the Township of Plympton and that part of the St. Clair River and Lake Huron within the corporate boundaries of the Township of Moore, the Village of Courtright, the Township of Sarnia, the City of Sarnia, the Village of Point Edward and the Township of Plympton";


The Honourable the Minister of Natural Resources therefore recommends that under section 9 of The Conservation Authorities Act,

- (a) the area over which the Authority has jurisdiction be enlarged;
- (b) the area over which the enlarged Authority has jurisdiction be:
  - (i) the watershed of the Sydenham River;
  - (ii) the watersheds of all other streams entering Lake Huron, the St. Clair River, the Chenal Ecarte and Lake St. Clair from the point where the north boundary of the Township of Plympton meets the shore of Lake Huron to the point where the north boundary of the Boyle Drain watershed meets the shore of Lake St. Clair;

- (iii) that part of Lake Huron, the St. Clair River, the Chenal Ecarte, Lake St. Clair and all islands therein within the corporate boundaries of the Township of Plympton, the Village of Point Edward, the City of Sarnia, the Township of Sarnia, the Village of Courtright, the Township of Moore, the Township of Sombra, the Township of Chatham and that part of the Township of Dover lying north of a line drawn due west (astronomic) from the point where the north boundary of the watershed of the Boyle Drain meets the shore of Lake St. Clair;
- (iv) the whole of the Township of Plympton and the Town of Forest;
- (c) that the following municipalities be designated as participating municipalities in the Authority:
  - 1. The Townships of Adelaide, Bosanquet, Brooke, Camden, Caradoc, Chatham Dawn, Dover, London, Metcalfe, Moore, Mosa, Plympton, Sarnia, Sombra, Warwick and Zone.
  - 2. The City of Sarnia.
  - 3. The towns of Bothwell, Dresden, Forest, Petrolia, Strathroy and Wallaceburg.
  - 4. The villages of Alvinston, Courtright, Newbury, Oil Springs, Point Edward, Watford and Wyoming.
- (d) the enlarged authority be named St. Clair Region Conservation Authority.

The Committee of Council concur in the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Natural Resources and advise that the same be acted on.
